\section*{AR'TICLE I}

GENERAL

Section 1. The Name: The name of the corporation shall be Station One, Inc.


Section 2. The Principal Office: The principal office of the corporation shall be Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina, c/o Dunlea Realty Company or at such other place as may be subsequently designated by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Definition: As used herein, the term "corporation" shall be the equivalent of "Association" as defined in the Declaration of Condominium for Station One Condominium, Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina; and all definitions set forth in the Declaration, to which these By-Laws are attached, shall be applicable herein, unless otherwise defined herein.

ARTICLE II
MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Definition: Each owner shall be a member of the corporation, and membership in the corporation shall be limited to owners of condominium units.

Section 2. Transfer of Membership and Ownership: Membership in the corporation may be transferred only as an incident to the transfer of the transferor's condominium unit and his undivided interest in the common areas and facilities of the condominium, and such transfer shall be subject to the procedures set forth in the Condominium Documents.

Section 1. Place: All meetings of the corporate membership shall be held at Station One Condominium, Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina or such other place as may be stated in the notice.

## Soction 2. Annual Meeting:

A. The annual meeting of members shall be held at Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina, in each year commencing in 1975; provided, however, that the initial annual membership meeting will not be held until the earlior of (1) the sale by Declarant, as defined in the Declaration, of all units in this condominium, or(2) notice by the Declarant or (3) two years from the date of recordation of the Declaration. If neither (a) nor (b) hes occurred by the first Friday in December, 1975, the first Board of Directors (the "Board") will notify all members that such initial annual meeting has been postponed, and that it will be re-scheduled at a later date. If same be rescheduled, the first Directors and the officers will hold office until the initial annual meeting.
B. Regular annual meetings subsequent to 1975 shall be held on the last Saturday in March in each year, if not a legal holiday, and if a legal holiday, then on the next secular day following, unless otherwise determined by the Board.
C. All annual meetings shall be held at such hour as is determined by the Board.
D. At the annual meeting, the members shall elect the new members of the Board of Directors and transact such other business as may properly come before the meeting.
E. Written notice of the annual meeting shall be served upon or mailed to each member entitled to vote thereafter at such address as appears
on the books of the corporation, at least ten (10) but not more than fifty (50) days prior to the meoting. Each member shall notify the Secretary of any addross change, and the giving of said notice shall be in all respects sufficient if sent to the address of the member which is then on file with the Secretary.

Section 3. Membership List: At least ten (10) but not more than fifty (50) days before every election of Directors, a complete list of members entitled to vote at said election, arrangod numerically by condominium units, With residence of each, shall be prepared by the Secretary. Such list shall be produced and kept for said ten (10) days prior to and throughout the election at the office of the corporation, and shall be open to examination by any member throughout such time.

Section 4. Special Meetings:
A. Special Meetings of the members, for any purpose or purposes not prescribed by statute, the Certificate of Incorporation, or these ByLaws, may be celled by the Board or at the request, in writing, of one-third $(1 / 3)$ of the members. Such request shall state the purpose or purposes of the proposed meoting.
B. Written notice of a Special Meeting of members, stating the time, place and object thereof, shall be served upon or mailed to each member entitled to vote thereat, at such address as appears on the books of the corporation, at least ten (10) days before such meeting.
C. Business transacted at all special meetings shall be confined to the objects stated in the notice thereof.

Section 5. Quorum: Over fifty percent (50\%) of the total number of members of the corporation, present in person or represented by written proxy, shall be requisite to and shall constitute a quorma at all meetings of the members for the transaction of business, except as otherwise provided by statute, by the Certificate of Incorporation or by these By-Laws. If,

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howover, such quorum shall not be present or represented at any meeting of the sembers, the members ontitled to vote thereat, present in person or represented by written proxy, shall have power to adfourn the meeting from time to time, without notice other than announcement at the meoting, until a quorum shall be present or represented. At such adjourned moeting at which a quorum shall be present or represented, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meoting originally called. If adjournment extends past 30 days, notice of the date on which the adjourned meoting is to be re-convened shall be given as herein provided for regular meetings.

Section 6. Vote Required to Transact Business: When a quorum is present at any meeting, a majority of the votes cast, in person or represonted by written proxy filed with the Secretary in advance of the meoting, shall decide any question brought before the meeting, unless the question is one upon which, by oxpress provision of the statutes, the Condominium Documents or these By-laws, a different voto is required, in which caso such express provision shall govern and control the decision of such question. There shall be no cumulative voting.

Section 7. Right to Vote: Each owner shall be entitled to one (1) vote. At any meeting of the members, every member having the right to vote shall be entitled to vote in person or by proxy. Such proxy shall only be valid for such meeting or subsequent adjourned meetings thereof. If more than one (1) person or entity own a unit, they shall file a certificate with the Secrem tary naming the person authorized to cast votes for said unit. If same is not on file, the vote of any co-owner present who is acceptable to other co-ommors of that unit presont shall bo accepted as the vote of all co-ownors. Any legal entity which is an owner shall have the right to membership in the Corporation.

Section 8. Haiver and Consent: Whenever the vote of members at a meeting is required or permitted by any provision of the statutes, the Condominium Docunents, or these By-LaHs to be taken in connection with any action of the corporation, the meeting and vote of members may be dispensed whth if all members who would have been entitled to vote upon the action of such meoting if such meeting woro held shall consent in writing to such action being taken.

Section 9. Order of Business: The ordar of business at annual
mombers' meetings and as far as practical at other members' meetings, will be:

1. Roll call and certifylng of proxies;
2. Proof of notice of meoting or waiver of notice;
3. Reading of minutes of prior meeting;
4. Officers' reports;
5. Committee reports;
6. Appointment by Cinalrman of inspectors of mection;
7. Approval of budget;
8. Elections of Directors and officers;
9. Unfinished business;
10. New business;
11. Adjournment.

ARTICLE IV BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Number and Term: The number of directors which shall
constitute the whole Board of Directors (the "Board") shall be five (5).
Until succeeded by directors elected at the first annual meeting of members, directors need not be members; thereafter, at least four (4) directors shall be mambers. Within the limits above specified, the number of directors shall be determined by the members at the annual meeting; the directors shall initially be elected to serve staggared terms, two (2) for three (3) years, two (2) for two (2) years, one for one (1) year, and they shall serve until their successors shall be elected and shall qualify. Thereafter, each director shall be elected for a texm of two (2) years.

Section 2, Vacancy and Roplacement: If the office of any director
becomes vacant by reason of transfer of ownership, death, resignation,
retirement, disqualification, removal from office or othervise, a majority of the romining directors, though less than quorus, at apecial meating of dixectors duly called for this purpose, shall choose a successor or successors, who shall hold office for the unexpired tern in respect to which such vacancy occurred.

Section 3. Removal: Directors may be removed by an affirmative vote of a majority of the total membership.

Section 4. First Board of Directors: The first Board shall consist of Stephen M. Cumbie, J. Franklin Martin, Frank M. Bell, Jr., Richard Dunlea, and Donald A. Furtado, who shall hold office and oxercise all powers of the Board until the initial annual momborship meeting, anything herein to the contraxy notwithstanding; provided, any or all of said directors shall be subject to replacement in the event of resignation or death as above provided.

Section 5. Powers: The property and business of the corporation shall be managed by the Board, which may exercise all corporate powors not specifically prohibited by statute, the Cortificate of Incorporation or the Declaration to which these By-Laws are attached. The powers of the Board shall specifically include, but not be limited to the following:
A. To make and collect rogular and special assessments and establish the time within which payment of samo are due.
B. To use and expend the assessments collected to maintain, care for and prosorve the units and condominium property, except those portions theroof which are required to be maintained, carod for and preserved by the owners.
C. To purchase the necessary equipment and tools required in the maintenance, care and preservation referred to above.
D. To enter into and upon the units when necessary and at
as little inconvenience to the owner as possible in connection with such maintenance, care and preservation.
E. To insure and keep insured the common areas and facilities of the condominium in the manner set forth in the Declaration against loss fron fire and/or other casualty, and the unit owners against public liability, and to purchase such other insurance as the Board may deem advisable, including insurance against Directors' liablifty.
F. To collect delinquent assessments by suit or otherwise,
abate nuisances and enjoin or seek damages from owners for violations of these By-Laws and the terms and conditions of the Condominium Documents.
G. To employ and compensate such personnel as may be required for the maintenance and preservation of the property. H. To make appropriate changes in the Rules and Regulations for the occupancy of the condominium units as may be deemed necessary. Changes not approved at the next meeting of the membership by a majority of the votes cast shall be invalid from the date of such change.
I. To acquire and/or rent and/or lease a condominium unit
in the name of the corporation or a designee.
J. To contract for management of the condominium and to delegate to such other party all powers and duties of the corporation except those specifically required by the Condominium Documents to have specific approval of the Board or membership.
K. To carry out the obligations of the corporation under any restrictions andor covenants running with any land submitted to the Condominitm ownership of this corporation or its mambers.
L. To designate, as the Board deems appropriate, assigned parking spaces for each unit, visitors, service vehicles, and other vehicles.

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M. To adopt Rules and Regulations pursuant to Article VIII of the By-Laws.
N.. To 1mpose a special assessment (against any omer), not to excead $\$ 50$ for each occurronce, for the violation by the owner or his guests of any rules or regulation adopted by the Board or the breach of any By-Law contained heroin, or the breach of any provision of the Declaration. Such assessment shall be in addition to any costs incurred or to be incurred by the corporation as result of the violation of the rule, regulation, By-Law, or provision.
0. If any lessee, renter or guest fails to comply with the terms of the Condominium Documents, then to terminate any written or oral lease or rontal agreonent; and to remove from anit, such Lessee, renter or guest.
P. To propose and adopt an annual budget for the proporty.
Q. To recomend one or more rental agents in accordance with the Declaration.

Section 6. Liability: The Directors shall not be liable to the ownors oxcept for their own individual willful misconduct, bad faith, or gross negligence.

Section 7. Compensation: Neither Directors nor officers shall recelve compensation for their services as such, provided that the corporation may budget such sums as it may deem appropriate for direct reimbursement of actual expenses incurred by the Directors or officers in bohalf of the corporation.

## Section 8. Meetings:

## A. The first meeting of each Board newly elected by the

 meabers shall bo hold immediately upon adjournment of the moeting at which thoy were olected, provided a quorum shallthen be prosent, or as soon thereafter as may be practicable.
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The annual meeting of the Buard shall be held at the same
place as the general members' meeting, and immediatelybefore or after the adjournment of samo.
B. Spocial meetings shall bo hold whenever called by thedirection of the President or a majority of the Board.The Secretary shall give notice of each special meetingeither personally, by mail or telegram, at lenst three(3) days before the date of such meoting, but the diractorsmay, in writing, waive notice of the calling of the meeting,before or after such meeting.
C. A majority of the Board shall be necessary and sufficientat all meetings to constitute a quorum for the transaction ofbusiness, and the act of a mafority present at any meetingat which there is a quorum shall be the act of the Board. Ifa quorum shall not be present at the meeting, the birectorsthen present may adjourn the meeting without notice otherthan announcement at the meeting until a quorum shall bepresent.
Section 9. Order of Business: The order of business at all meetings
of the Board shall be as follows
A. Roll call;
B. Proof of notice of meeting or waiver of notice;
C. Reading of Minutes of last meeting;
D. Consideration of communications;
E. Elections of necessary Directors and Officers;
F. Reports of officers and employees;
G. Reports of committees;
i1. Unfinished business;
I. Original resolutions and new business;
J. Adjournment.


#### Abstract

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Section 10. Annual Statement: The Board shall present, no less often than at the annual meeting, a full and clear statement of the businass and condition of the corporation, including a report of the operating expenses of the corporation and the assessments paid by oach member.

\section*{ARTICLE V <br> OFFICERS}

Section 1. Executive Officers: The executive officers of the corporation shall be a President; Secretary; and Vice President and Treasurer; all of thom shall be elected annually by the Board from the Membership. No two offices may be united in one person. If the Board so determines, there may be more than one Vice President. Any or all officors may also be Directors of the corporation.


Saction 2. Subordinate officers: The Board may appoint such other officers and agents from the membership as they may deen necessary, who shall have such authority and perform such duties as from time to time may be prescribed by said Board.

Section 3. Tenure of officers: Removal: All officers shall be subject to removal, with or without cause, at any time by action of the Board. The Board may delegate powers of removal of subordinate officers and agents to any officer.

Section 4. The President:
A. The President shall preside at all meetings of the members and directors; he shall have general and active management of the business of the corporation; he shall see that ail orders and resolutions of the Board are carried into effect; he shall execute bonds, mortgages, deeds of trust and other contracts requiring a soal, under the seal of the corporation.
B. He shall have general superintendence and direction of all the other officers of the corporation, and shall see that their duties are poformed properly.
C. Ile shall submit a report of the operations of the corproation for the fiscal yoar to the Directors whenover called for by them, and to the members at the annual meeting, and from time to time shall report to the Board all matters within his knowledge which the interest of the corporation may require to be brought to their notice.
D. He shall be an ex-officio member of all committeas, and shall have the general powers and duties of supervision and management usually vested in the office of the President of a corporation.

Section 5. The Secretary:
A. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the members' and of the Board's meetings in one or more books provided for that purpose;
B. He shall see that all notices are fully given in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws or a:. required by law.
C. lle shall be custodian of the corporate records and of the seal of the corporation and shall see that the seal of the corporation is affixed to all dociments, the execution of which on behalf of the corporation under its seal is duly authorized in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws.
D. He shall keep a register of the post office address of each member, which shall be furnished to the Secretary by such member.
B. In genoral, he shall perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the President or by the Board of Directors.

## Section 6. The Vice Prosidont - Troasurer:

A. The Vice President and Treasurer shall be vested with all the powers and required to perform all the duties of the President in his absence, and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board.
B. He shall keep full and accurate accounts of receipts and disbursements in books belonging to the corporation, and shall doposit all monies and other valuable offects in the name and to the credit of the corporation, in such depositories as may be designated by tho Board.
C. Ho shall disburse the funds of the corporation as ordered by the Board, taking proper vouchers for such disbursements, and shall render to the President and Directors, at the regular meetings of the Board, or whonever they may require it, an account of all his transactions as Treasurer and of the financial condition of the corporation. Such records shell be opon to inspection by members at reasonable times.
D. He may be required to give the corporation, at the corporation's cost, a bond in a sum and with one or more sureties satisfactory to the Board, for the faithful performance of the duties of his office, and the restoration to the corporation, in case of his death, resignation or removal from office, of all books, papers, vouchers, money or other property of whatever kind in his possession belonging to the corporation.
E. lie shall maintain a register for the names of any mortgage holders or lien holders on units who have requested in writing that they be registored and to whom the corporation will give notice of default in case of non-ppyment of assossments. No rosponsiblity of the corporation is assumed with respect to said register except that it will give notice of default of any owner in his obligations to the corporation to any registered mortgagee or lienor therein, if so requested by said mortgagee or 1 ienor.
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F. With the approval of the Board, he shall be authorized to dolegate all or part of his responsibilities to competent accounting, collection or management personnel, pursuant to written definition of the responsibilities delegated to, and the condition of performance imposed upon, such personnel; but, in such event, the Treasurer shall retain supervisory responsibilities.

Section 7. Vacancies: If the office of any Director or officer becomes vacant by reason of death, resignation, disqualification or otherwise, the remaining Directors, by a majority vote of the remaining Directors provided for in these By-Laws, may choose a successor or successors who shall hold office for the unexpired term. If the number of Directors falls below three, a spacial members meeting shall be called for the purpose of filling such vacancies in the Board of Directors.

Section 8. Resignations: Any Director or officer may resign his office at any time, such resignation to be made in writing, and to take effect from the time of its receipt by the Board of Directors, unless some later time be fixed in the resignation, and then from that date. The acceptance of a resignation by the Board shall not be required to make it effective.

ARTICLE VI
NOTICES

Section 1. Definition: Whenever under the provisions of the statutes, the Condominium Documents, the Certificate of Incorporation, or these By-Laws, notice is required to be given to any Director or member, it shall not be construed to mean personal notice, but such notice may be given in writing by mail, by depositing the same in a post office or letter box in a postpaid, sealed envelope, addressed as appears on the books of the corporation.

Section 2. Service of Notice - Waiver: Whenever any notice is required to be given under the provisions of the statutes, the Condominium
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Documents, the Certificate of Incorporation, or these By-Laws, a waiver
thereof, in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed the equivalent thereof.

Section 3. Address: The address for notice of the corporation shall be that of the Registered Agent for service of process on the corporation.

## ARTICLE VII

FINANCES

Section 1. Fiscal Year: The fiscal year shall be the calendar year.

Section 2. Checks: All checks or demands for money and notes of the corporstion shall be signed by any one of the following officers: President, Secretary, or Vice President and Treasurer, or by such officer or officers or such other person or persons as the Board of Directors may from time to time designate.

## Section 3. Determination of Assessments:

A. The Board shall determine from time to time the sum or sums necessary and adequate for the common expense of the condominium property. At the annual meeting of the corporation, such budget shall be submitted to the members for approval. As approved, the budget shall constitute the basis for all Regular Assessments for common expenses against unit omers, which assessments shall be due and payable periodically as determined by the Board. Common expenses shall include expenses for the operation, maintenance, repair or replacement of the common areas and facilities, costs of carrying out the powers and duties of the corporation, all insurance premiums and expenses relating therato, and any other expenses designated as common expense from time to time by the Board of Directors of the corporation.

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B. The Board is spectfically empowered on behalf of the corporation to make and collect assessments and to maintain repair and replace the conmon areas and facilities of the condominium. Funds for the payment of common expenses shall be assessed against the unit owners in the proportions or percentages of sharing common expenses provided in the Declaration. Assossments shall be payable periodically as determined by the Board.
C. Special assessments for common expenses not adequately funded through the Regular Assessments may be required by tho Board and shall be lovied and paid in the same manner as hereinbefore provided for Regular Assessments. Notwithstanding anything in these By-Laws or the Declaration which authorize assessments and expenditures, no special Assessment exceeding \$75. per unit per annum or expenditure for the improvement of the common areas and facilitios oxceeding $\$ 7,500$ por annum for all units shall be made without the approval of a majority vote of the membership, except for the repair of the common axeas and facilities due to damage and destruction, which repair shall occur as provided in the Declaration.
D. Special assessments against an; owner for (1) any repair, maintenance or replacement undertaken in beha; fof the owner pursuant to Paragraph 11 of the Declaration (2) any violation, as set forth in Article IV, Section 6 i of the By-Laws or (3) any other valid purpose authorized by the Condominium Documents, shall be levied at such times as is determined by the Board.
E. When the Board has determined the amount of any assessment, the Vice President and Treasurer of the corporation (or the personnel to whom such authority has been delegated) shall mail or present a statement of the assessment to each of the assessed owners. All assessments shall be payable to the corporation, and upon request, the Vice President-Treasurer or his designated agent shell give a receipt for each payment made.
F. The Board may enter into a management contract with third parties
to whom the Board may delegate the power to levy and collect assessments
approved by the Board or required by the Condominium Documents.

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G: All assessments not paid when dụe shall bear interest at such rate as is determined by the Board of Directors, not to exceed the maximum permissible rate allowed by law.


#### Abstract

Section 4. Excess of Assessments: In any year in which there is an excess of assessments received over amounts actually used or payable for the purposes described in these By-Laws and in the Declaration, such excoss shall, unless othervise determined by the Board of Directors of the Association, be deposited in a capital reserve account for use in replacement, ropair or maintenance of the common areas and facilities of the Association.


Section 5. Non-Profit Corporation: The seal of the corporation shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation, the year of its organization, and the words "Non-Profit". Said seal may be used by causing it or a facsimile thereof to be impressed, affixed, reproduced or otherwise.

## ARTLCLE VIII

DEFAULT

Section 1. Enforcement of Lien for Assessments: In the ovent an owner does not pay any sums, charges, or assessments required to be paid to the corporation by the due date, the corporation, acting on its own behalf or through its Board, may enforce its lien for assessments, or take such other action to recover the sums, charges or assessments to which it is entitled, in accordance with the Declaration and the statutes made and pro$v$ ided or both.

Section 2. Governmental Liens and Assessments: In the event
that an owner fails to pay any tax or assessment lawfully assessed by any governmental subdivision within which the property is situated, by the date such tax or assessment is due, the Board may pay the same from the funds of the corporation and specially assess such owner for the amount paid.

Saction 3. Porgclosure: If the corporation beconos the omper of a unit by reason of foreclosure, it shall offer said unit for sale and at such timo as ande is consumated, it shali deduct from the proceeds of sald sale all suas of money due it for assessments and charges, all costa incurred in the bringing of the foreclosure suit, including remsonable attorney's faes, funds necessary to discharge any liens or mortgages of record, and any and all expenses incurred in the resale of the unit, which shall include but not be limited to advertising expenses, real estate brokerage fees and expenses necessary for the ropairing and refurnishing of the unit in question. Ali monies romaining after doducting the foregoing items of oxpenses, costs and othor deductipns shall be returned to the former owner of subject unit.

Section 4. Othor Romadios: In the event of violation of the provisions of the Condominita Documents as the same are dofined in the Deciaration, for thirty (30) days after. notice from the Association to the unit owners to correct said violation, the corporation, on its own behalf or by and through its Board of Diractors, may bring appropriate action to onjoin such violation or may onforce the provisions of said Condominium Documonts, or may sue for damages, or take such other courses of action, or other legal remedy as it or they may decm appropriate.

Saction 5. Legal Costs: In the event any legal action is brought against an owner and rosults in judgment for the corporation, the omer shall pay the corporation's reasonable attorney's fees, costs of collection, and court costs.

Section 6. Intent: Each owner, for himself, his hoirg, successors and assigns, agrees to the foragoing provisions relating to default and abatement of nuisance, regardless of the harshoss of the remedy available to the corporation and regardless of the availability of the other equaily adequate legal procedures. It is the intent of all owners of units to give to the corporation a mothod and . procedure which will enable it at all times to operate on business-like basis,

to collect those montes due and owing it from the owners of mint, nud to presorve each unit owner's right to onjoy his unit, free from unreasonable restraint and nuisance.


## ARTICLE IX <br> RULES AND REGULATIONS


#### Abstract

In addition to the other provisions of these By-Jaws, any Rules and Regulations (adopted by the Board), together with any subsequent changes shall govern, to the extent not inconsistent with these By-Laws and the Declaration, the use of the units located in the property and the conduct of all owners, residents and guests, such Rules and Regulations shall be in effect until the first elected Board of Directors Meeting, at which time they shall be subject to such changes as may be deemed appropriate. Any further modifications in the Rules and Regulations may be made by the Board of Directors in accordance with Article IV, Section 5 of the By-Laws.


## ARTICLE X

JOINT OWNERSHIP

Membership may be held in the name of more than one owner. In the event ownership is in more than one person, all of the joint owners shall be entitled collectively to only one voice or ballot in the management of the affairs of the corporation, and the vote may not be divided between plural ownors. The manner of detemining who shall cast such vote shall be as set forth in Article II, Section 7.

## ARTICLE XI

INDEMNIFICATION

The corporation may indemnify any porson made a party to an action by or in the right of the corporation to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of his being or having been a director or officer of the corporation, against the reasonable expenses including attorneys' fees actually and necessarily incurred by him in connection with the defense or settlement of such action, or in connection with an appeal therein, except in relation to such matters as to which such

#  <br> director or officer is adjudged to have been guilty of gross negligence or misconduct in the performance of his duty to the corporation. 

## ARTICLE XII

AMENDMENT

These By-Laws may only be altered, amended or added to at any duly called meeting of the members; provided (1) that the notice of the meeting shall contaln a full statement of the proposed amendment; (2) that the quorum requirement for such purposes shall be majority of all the then members, in person or by proxy; (3) that there be an affirmative vote of owners holding not less than two-thirds $(2 / 3)$ of the qualified votes of members represented at such quorum; and (4) that there is or has been an affirmative vote of the Board of Directors. Article III, Section 2A may not be anended without express approval of Declarant, as defined in the Declaration. No amendment to these By-Laws shall be passed which would operate to impair or prejudice the rights and/or liabilities of any mortgagee, and no amendment shall become operative uniess set forth in an amended Declaration and duly recorded. All unit owners shall be bound to abide by any amendment upon the same being passed and duly set forth in an amended Declaration, duly recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Nev Hanover County, North Carolina.

ARTICLE XIII
CONSTRUCTION

Wherever the masculine singular form of the pronoun is used in these By-Laws, it shall be construed to mean the masculine, feminine or neuter, singular or plural, wherever the context so requires,

Should any of the covenants herein imposed be void or be or
become unenforceable at law or in equity, the remaining provisions of this instrument shall nevertheless be and remain in full force and effect.

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The foregoing were adopted as the By-Laws of Station One, Inc. at the first meoting of its first Board of Directors.
